CWA/AT&T CORE CONTRACT EXPIRATION DATE APRIL 9, 2016!

As of May 1st, we are **344** DAYS away from the expiration of our CORE contract and we need to start preparing just in case we have labor disputes. It would be a good idea to postpone any large financial purchases and we must be ready to strike. AT&T Legacy T has started negotiations and is at bargaining report #37. They are pushing for a fairness contract that includes increases in benefits, wages and our pension plan. Keep on pushing harder Legacy T!

District 9 Conference in San Jose

Our Local attended District 9 Conference in San Jose on April 1st to 3rd and heard California Public Utility Commissioner Catherine Sandoval saying she will hold utility companies (that includes AT&T) accountable for providing services to customers and maintaining their plants. Local 9410 also met with current CWA National Secretary-Treasurer Annie Hill and heard her messages on why she should be re-elected. District 1 VP Chris Shelton (the next CWA National President because he is running unopposed) spoke about the future of the CWA. At the CWA National Convention in June, District 9 will elect a Vice President along with the National President, National Secretary-Treasurer and the remaining District VP's.

Local 9410 unanimously endorsed District 9 Staff Rep Tom Runnion for the office of District 9 Vice President, along with CWA National Secretary-Treasurer Annie Hill to retain her office. We ask our fellow Locals to support them. GOOD LUCK!

INTERNATIONAL WORKERS

International Workers' Day was to honor the Haymarket affair where fellow Union members where killed by police. The plan by Federation of Organized Trades Labor Unions called for a nationwide strike, 8 hour work day, and no cut in pay which 300,000 workers went on strike for nationwide. In San Francisco, this May 1st celebrates minimum wage increase to \$12.25 an hour, and eventual increase to \$15 in 2018, the highest in the country.

San Francisco Board of Supervisors passed two ordinances that are referred to as the SF Retail Workers Bill of Rights; 1) Hours and Retention Protections for Formula Retail Employees and 2) Fair Scheduling and Treatment of Formula Retail Employees that protect full-time workers and fair schedules. Let's continue the fight and struggle for better wages and benefits. Bill was passed November 24, 2014 and takes effect June 22, 2015. Thank you past BOS President.

Mother's Day in Ancient Times

Some sources claim Mother's Day origins lie in antiquity. According to MothersDayCentral.com, the ancient Egyptians held ceremonies and celebrations each year to honor the goddess Isis. To the Egyptians, Isis represented motherhood and fertility, and was believed to be the mother of Horus, who was considered to be the mythological ruler of Egypt. 

CAL LABOR FED CONFERENCE

California Labor Federation Conference was held in Sacramento on April 12th - 15th. Governor Jerry Brown, Attorney General Kamala Harris and Speaker from both the Assembly and Senate spoke in support of labor issues. State Senator Mark Leno (100% voting record for labor issues) and freshman Assistant to Speaker Pro Tempore Assemblyman David Chiu (who has a 97% voting record for labor) met with our Local members and supported all of our labor concerns. Assemblyman Phil Ting's staff met with our team to hear our concerns, and Senator Leno is currently working on a California \$15 an hour minimum wage, and Assemblyman David Chiu is working on the California Retail Workers Bill of Rights. We need to continue to support elected officials who support labor issues to make California a better place to work and live!
